Criteria for Freshman Admission through Direct Admission:

Students who graduate from secondary school prior to enrollment at WIU will be eligible for **direct admission** if they have a GPA of 3.00 on a 4.00 scale.

All students who receive Direct Admission will be awarded a scholarship of up to \$6,000 per year (\$24,000 over four years). Students below a 3.00 GPA will be considered for Admission into an alternative admission program, called Reach. Additional information for Reach may be requested after you apply for admission.

Criteria for **Transfer Admission** through **Direct Admission**:

To be eligible for **Direct Admission** to the institution as a transfer student, a student must have completed 30 credit-hours of post-secondary coursework at a regionally accredited institution of higher education with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale.

Note: For applicants who are applying to programs that require a portfolio review, audition, or other limited admissions requirements (which may include a GPA above general admission criteria, an SAT or ACT), they must still meet those requirements for admissions consideration to those programs.
